HOW TO ENTER

Please ensure that you have read this schedule thoroughly including the Rules and Regulations, Conditions of Entry, Closing Dates and Definitions. Carefully select the classes in which you would like to enter. Please contact Administration if you are unsure of definitions. Each Exhibitor must have their own entry form.

1. ONLINE ENTRIES

Enter online via <u>https://showday.online/show/royalgeelong</u> and follow the links. It is secure, quick and easy. If you are entering online you are agreeing to the terms & conditions and the entry is accepted as signed.

2. MANUAL ENTRIES

Each Exhibitor must have their own entry form, manual entry forms <u>must</u> be signed by the Exhibitor. <u>A Sheep Health Statement and a</u> <u>current copy of a Brucellosis Certificate must be included with your entry</u>. Incomplete entry forms will not be processed.

3. ENTRY FEES

You must include payment for your entries in full at the time of entry. Don't forget to include any additional requirements on your entry form. Entry fees member \$15, non member \$20 (unless otherwise stated), scan fee \$6, fleece \$5, lambswool \$5

4. PASSES

Stud Sheep and Fleece individual entries that exceed \$25 will receive 1 complimentary day pass. All Exhibitors will receive a Stock Vehicle Pass to enter the Showgrounds which allows the **driver** to enter free of charge.

5. CLOSING DATES

Entries strictly close on the advertised closing dates. Late entries will not be accepted under any circumstances.

6. ENTRY CONFIRMATION & PASSES

Entry confirmation will allow entry to the Showgrounds with Exhibits.

STUD SHEEP REGULATIONS

HEALTH REGULATIONS

- As a condition of entry, all sheep Exhibitors are required to complete and submit the National Sheep Health Statement (July 2019) and provide a Brucellosis Certificate.
- All sheep may be inspected at the RGAPS Sheep Committee's discretion to ensure they are not infected with footrot or any external parasites. If any are found to be infected, they will be removed from the Showgrounds immediately.
- 3. All sheep that are exhibited must be in good acceptable condition.
- 4. All Health Documentation must all be included with the Official Entry Form and must be signed by the Exhibitor, otherwise sheep cannot be accepted on the Showgrounds. Online entrants must forward copies of health documents to the RGAPS office via post or email prior to entry closing date
- All entries must come from an <u>Ovine Brucellosis</u> <u>Accredited Free Stud</u>. All exhibitors must provide proof of their current Ovine Brucellosis accreditation including the Flock Accreditation No. and Expiry Date, a letter from a veterinary practioner <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- All Exhibits must be declared free of Virulent Footrot within the National Sheep Health Declaration (July 2019) to be eligible for competition.
- All Stud Sheep exhibited under the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders must be exhibited in accordance with the Regulations of the recognised Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association Flock Book.
- Sheep exhibited as Poll Dorset must be recognised in the Australian Poll Dorset Association Flock Book. White Suffolk, Texel, Corriedale and any other registered Breed in Australia must be applicable to their Society's breed requirements.
- All Sheep exhibited in the Short Wool Section are not to have more than 25mm of wool on Show Day except where stated. Note: Border Leicester exhibits please check the Border Leicester section for shearing dates. Long Wool Section - No Sheep entered in shorn classes is to have more than 50mm of wool on Show Day.
- Sheep and goats admitted to the Geelong Showgrounds must be identified in accordance with Agriculture Victoria (EDJTR) Electronic National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) (Sheep & Goats) Standards.
- 11. Sheep from a location outside of Victoria must be identified in accordance with the legal requirements in the jurisdiction from which they were dispatched.
- 12. All sheep will be scanned and reported to the NLIS database

GENERAL ENTRY INFORMATION

- 13. All sheep must be owned or bred by the exhibitor.
- 14. No exhibit shall be entered in more than one class
- except where stated in the schedule, lambs accepted.15. Each single class will be restricted to three (3) entries per exhibitor. In the case of pairs, only two (2) pairs can be
- entered per exhibitor.16. All Classes detailing Ewe with lamb at foot, both will be judged.
- 17. All Lambs entered must be in wool (unshorn) and dropped after 1st of April, 2023
- 18. Feed and water containers must be provided by the Exhibitor.
- Vehicles transporting stock must adhere the Stock Vehicle Pass to the windscreen otherwise Gate entry will be refused.
- 20. Only Experienced Handlers are to parade sheep.
- Most Successful Exhibitor in Stud Sheep Any Breed. The winner is decided on points 1st - 5pts, 2nd - 3pts, 3rd - 1 point. In the instance of a tie, 2 points for Champion and 1 point for Reserve Champion. No points will be allotted in any class unless there are two or more Exhibitors. Only one breed of sheep to count for each Exhibitor

PENNING

- 22. All sheep are requested to be penned by 12.00pm Thursday 18th October.
- 23. Exhibits must not be removed from the Showgrounds before 4.00pm Saturday 21st October. Exhibitors with the longest distance to travel will be allowed to leave first.

PLEASE NOTE: THE SHEEP PAVILION WILL CLOSE AT 7.00PM THURSDAY 18TH OCTOBER, 2023.

GENERAL RGAPS RULES

ENTRIES

- 24. All Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the close of entries.
- 25. All entries must be lodged on the Official Entry Form or online, on or before the nominated closing date.
- 26. All entry fees as specified in Schedule must be paid at time of entry.
- 27. Exhibitors must give such information regarding their Exhibits as RGAPS may require and submit Statutory Declarations with such information, and produce evidence if called upon by RGAPS. In case of noncompliance, the Exhibit may be disqualified and the prize withheld.
- 28. RGAPS has the right to refuse any entry, refuse any Exhibit entered, the right to compete without giving any reason for same, provided the entrance money is returned.

29. Entry fees for withdrawn exhibits will not be refunded.

JUDGING

- 30. Exhibitors will be required to place Exhibits as directed by the Chief Stewards.
- 31. The decision of the Judge as to the merits of Exhibits shall be final and without appeal.
- Where Special prizes are offered in a Class, the First prize offered by RGAPS will be withdrawn unless otherwise specified.
- 33. RGAPS reserves the right to allot a trophy in place of prize money or vice-versa.
- 34. The Judges' may withhold a prize or award a lesser prize.
- 35. The Judges' decision is final.
- 36. RGAPS will not be held responsible in cases where wrong Class tickets have been given to Exhibitors after judging has commenced. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to check section tickets with the Prize Schedule prior to the Show.
- 37. The Committee/Stewards reserve the right to modify classes according to the number of entries received.
- 38. Protests awards based on non-compliance with the conditions of the Prize Schedule or the Regulations will be taken into consideration by RGAPS if lodged with the Chief Steward one hour after the Judge has made their award or for Classes where a prize is not awarded by 3:00pm on the day of competition together with \$50 as a guarantee of the bona fide of the protest. The money will be returned if the protest is upheld. RGAPS decision will be final and without further appeal, excluding the dog section, which is affiliated with and controlled by the Rules of Dogs Victoria.

PRIZES

- 39. Perpetual Trophies will remain in the Administration Building, Geelong Showgrounds.
- If, due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for any sponsored class, the prizemoney/prize may not be provided by RGAPS.
- 41. RGAPS reserves the right to use photographs and videos of entries at any time, present or in the future.
- 42. Prizemoney is GST inclusive. If you are registered for GST, the onus is on the Exhibitor to remit GST to the ATO and provide RGAPS with a Tax Invoice.
- 43. Any prize (trophy, voucher, etc.) awarded by RGAPS at any of their competitions and left unclaimed for a period of six months, will be forfeited and cancelled by the RGAPS Management Council.
- Any prizemoney cheques not presented within twelve (12) months from the date of the Show will be cancelled by the RGAPS Management Council.
- 45. Any infringement of these Regulations may disqualify the Exhibitor from taking a prize. Any dispute as to the construction of these Regulations or the interpretation of the Prize Schedule shall be determined by RGAPS, whose decision is final and without appeal.

46. Results will be posted on the Royal Geelong Show website after completion of the show.

ACCESS

- 47. For entry outside of show hours appropriate vehicle passes must be attached to the windscreen of the vehicle, otherwise entry will be refused.
- 48. Gate instructions must be strictly adhered to.
- 49. No vehicle is permitted entry after 9:00am.
- 50. No Exhibit will be admitted onto the Showgrounds, unless Exhibitor Pass is presented at the gate.
- 51. Security and Show gate personnel have the right to enforce all Regulations regarding gate access to the Geelong Showgrounds
- 52. Implements, machinery and commercial exhibits, livestock and general exhibits must be in their designated areas within the Showgrounds by 8:00am on each morning of the Show.

ANIMALS

- 53. No animals, implements etc. except those entered, will be allowed on the Showgrounds.
- 54. Exhibitors must state as accurately as possible, at time of entry, the date of birth of all stock in classes where age is specified, and in all sheep classes, the time of last shearing.
- 55. Dogs must be registered under the Regulations adopted by Dogs Victoria.
- 56. Water will be provided for stock exhibited, but Exhibitors must provide their own fodder.
- 57. All vehicles bringing livestock Exhibits to the yards must be removed from the Showgrounds after discharging their loads, or placed where directed by the Stewards of the Section.
- 58. Primary Producers who show their animals are required to have Public Liability Insurance.
- If, in the opinion of RGAPS any exhibition of livestock is unsound, either temporary or otherwise, the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon of RGAPS may be obtained at cost of the exhibitor.
- 60. It is the owner's responsibility to provide security to ensure that their animals are kept safe and secure for the duration of their time at the Geelong Showgrounds.

PROPERTY & BEHAVIOUR

- 61. RGAPS shall not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss or damage of exhibits or displays, all exhibits and displays are accepted solely at the exhibitor's own risk. RGAPS will not be responsible for Exhibits, but every reasonable care will be taken of the same.
- 62. The Royal Geelong Agricultural & Pastoral Society will not be held liable for any injuries that may be suffered by a person or persons taking part on behalf of an Exhibitor. In the event of an incident, RGAPS will appoint attendants to take charge and control all of his/her entries.

- 63. All Exhibitors have a Duty of Care to avoid situations that could lead to injury to themselves or other people. This Duty of Care extends to the prevention of damage to property.
- 64. No Exhibitor shall interfere with the Exhibits in ANY WAY whatsoever during the time the Exhibition is open. Anyone interfering without the permission of the Stewards may be expelled from the Showgrounds.
- 65. No person will be permitted to put any placard or advertisement on pens or grounds without the permission of the Operations Manager. Proprietorship remains that of RGAPS.
- 66. If, in the opinion of the Stewards, the conduct of any Exhibitor or any other person shall be such as to demand such a course, they shall have the power to forfeit any or all prizes such Exhibitors may have won, and may further cause such person or Exhibitor and Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds.
- 67. Exhibitors must comply with any reasonable request of RGAPS representatives.
- 68. All areas must be kept clean and tidy with clearly defined and available access and exit routes always. Build-up of combustible waste must be avoided always.

SAFETY

- 69. Care must be taken to minimize trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.
- 70. Exhibitors must notify the Section/Pavilion Supervisor or Administration immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulted in:
 - a. the injury, illness or death of any person or animal.
 - b. the damage, destruction or loss of property.
- Emergency information and maps showing Emergency Assembly Points are in the various animal pavilions and buildings. Exhibitors should be familiar with these plans.
- 72. Exhibitors should supply their own Safety Switch (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
- 73. Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.
- 74. The use of double adapters is strictly prohibited. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection.
- 75. Beverages/Food brought onto the Showgrounds in glass containers is strictly forbidden.
- 76. Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.
- 77. Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
- 78. No naked flames are permitted.

- 79. Firefighting and other Emergency Equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to Section/Pavilion Supervisor or Administration immediately.
- 80. All Exhibitor electrical items, including leads, must have a current safety compliance tag.

HOUSEKEEPING

- 81. Smoking is not permitted inside buildings, within 10m of a building entrance, near food sales and eating areas, combustibles, during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.
- 82. Alcohol is not permitted to be brought onto the Geelong Showgrounds.
- Security and Show personnel have the right to enforce all Regulations and control regarding people's behaviour and remove those persons as determined.
- All waste, including liquids, must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.
- 85. Media comment about matters involving RGAPS or the Showgrounds is co-ordinated by the President.
