CATTLE - HOW TO ENTER

Please ensure that you have read this schedule thoroughly including the Rules and Regulations, Conditions of Entry, Closing Dates and Definitions. Carefully select the classes in which you would like to enter. Please contact Administration if you are unsure of definitions. Each Exhibitor must have their own entry form.

1. ONLINE ENTRIES

Enter online at <https://showday.online/show/royalgeelong> and follow the link. It is secure, cheaper, quicker and easier. If you are entering online, you are agreeing to the terms & conditions and the entry is accepted as signed.

2. MANUAL ENTRIES

Each Exhibitor must have their own entry form. Manual Entry Forms must be signed by the Exhibitor. Health Declarations and Certificates must be included with your entry.

3. ENTRY FEES

You must include payment for your entries in full at the time of entry.
Don't forget to include any additional requirements on your entry form.

4. CERTIFICATES

Health declarations are to be provided when entering. Breed registration certificates must be carried at all times and be presented to Judges/Stewards/RGAPS on request.

5. PRIZE MONEY

All prize money paid will be direct deposited. No cash.

6. PASSES

Beef and Dairy entries will receive 1 complimentary 2 day pass plus an additional 2 day pass per \$30 of entries received. All Exhibitors will receive a **Stock Vehicle Pass** to enter the Showgrounds which allows the driver to enter free of charge. Additional Stock Vehicle Passes can be purchased on entry forms.

7. CLOSING DATES

Entries strictly close on the advertised closing dates. Late entries will not be accepted under any circumstances.

8. ENTRY CONFIRMATION & PASSES

Entry confirmation and passes will be mailed to you approximately two weeks prior to the Royal Geelong Show.

Tips for entering cattle online

- 1 - Type the animal details on left hand side of screen
- 2 - Select all classes INCLUDING interbreed and junior show for that animal.
- 3 - Click green "add entry" button
- 4 - Then repeat step for next exhibit.

CATTLE REGULATIONS

CATTLE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

CAMP KITCHEN AVAILABLE

Exhibitors should familiarise themselves with the conditions of entry outlined in the General Regulations and Special Regulations in this schedule.

The committee has the power to evict any Exhibitor or Exhibit from the showgrounds in the event of a breach of these conditions

1. Royal Geelong Show will operate in accordance with the All Dairy Breeds National Show Ring Code Of Ethics. All exhibitors must uphold and comply with this code. Further information available from www.royalgeelongshow.org.au
2. Owner's full name, address and Stud name must be included on the Official Entry Form.
3. Copies of Breed Registration must be provided to RGAPS or Superintendent on request.
4. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner(s) shown on the Registration Certificate.
5. All Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor. The Exhibit's Registration Certificate must show the Exhibitor's name as the registered owner or as one of the owners. All exhibits may be subject to inspection under the bona fide Exhibitor's conditions.
6. Cattle Exhibitors must use the National Cattle Health Statement Version 2 May 2018. The Health Declaration form must be signed by the Exhibitor and returned with your entry form otherwise entries cannot be accepted.
7. Exhibitors are required to have Public Liability Insurance.
8. A limited number of frame spaces for Preparation frames will be available in specified locations, provided an application for space and a \$20 fee accompanies the entries on the Official Entry Form.
9. Preparation Frames must be of a sound and safe construction with a secure floor. Preparation frames not deemed to be of a safe and sound construction by the Cattle Committee, must be immediately removed and payment forfeited.
10. Straw is provided for bedding at a cost of \$10 per head which must be paid on the entry form.
11. One Stock Vehicle Pass will be issued per Exhibitor and must be adhered to the windscreen of the vehicle, otherwise entry will be refused.
12. Stock Exhibitor Support Vehicle Pass provides access to drop off and pick up equipment and feed.
13. All exhibitors' electrical items (including leads) must have current safety compliance tags.
14. All exhibitors' name boards are the property of RGAPS and must not be removed.
15. Drilling into wood and/or bitumen in and around the cattle pavilion is not permitted.
16. All exhibitors and/or attendants must wear the approved breed/society uniform whilst showing.

17. Overnight accommodation is for exhibitors only. Tents /caravans are not permitted to be in vehicle parking area.
18. Sashes or ribbons won in breed competitions must not be displayed during judging.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE OF CATTLE

19. Dairy cattle: may arrive from Sunday 14th October from 12:00pm up until the time of class judging.
20. Dairy cattle: exhibitors are required to depart by 4.00pm Friday 20th October.
21. Beef cattle: may arrive on site from 8.00pm Friday 20th October, unless arranged prior.
22. Beef cattle: exhibitors are required to stay until 5.00pm Sunday 22nd October.

SPECIAL DAIRY REGULATIONS

23. Milking Machines:
 - a. An additional space will be provided to all dairy exhibitors for storage of their milking machines. Milking machines will also be available on the showgrounds if required.
24. Handlers:
 - a. only experienced handlers are to parade cattle
 - b. children aged 10 years and under who lead cattle must be accompanied by an adult
25. Judging:
 - a. Judging will be in the order of the schedule unless altered by the Chief Steward.
 - b. A Dry Cow is defined as not giving more than two litres of milk per day.
 - c. All adult dairy cattle birthdates must be in the calendar year.

SPECIAL BEEF REGULATIONS

26. Pesti Virus: All beef cattle exhibited must be tested for pesti virus and certified as non PI (Persistently infected) cattle.
27. Certification of testing and proof of non PI status must be provided with entries in the form of a signed Veterinary certificate or laboratory report listing animal and their identification.
28. Competition in this section is available to animals that are registered as Adults or in the Calf Register of their respective Herd Book Societies of Australasia (except classes of the Junior Section, 3004-3007)
29. Nose Rings, Halters & Leads: All cattle must be restrained in the following manner:
 - a. when stalled, each animal must be securely tied up by an effective neck rope collar and halter.
 - b. at any other time, the minimum requirements are:

MALES: must wear a suitable halter with its own lead rope attached and:

 - i. Under 9 months of age must be restrained by a nose grip or nose ring attached to a suitable lead rope.

- ii. 9 months and over and must be restrained by a nose ring attached to a suitable lead rope.

FEMALES: must wear a suitable halter with its own lead rope attached and 9 months of age and over will be restrained by a nose grip attached to a suitable lead rope.

- i. Calves must be tethered at all times.

30. Calves at Foot:
 - a. A suckling calf of an exhibit may be admitted to the judging ring if it is under 9 months of age as at 22nd October 2023. The calf is to be the natural born progeny of the exhibit and bear all the identification requirements of the breed society /association regulations, if born prior to arrival on the Showgrounds.
 - b. Calves 9 months and over from 22nd October 2023 **MUST** be entered into the breed classes on the Saturday of the show.
 - c. Calves must be eligible to be registered with the relevant breed society / association.
 - d. All calves at foot must be tested for pesti virus
31. Handlers: Only experienced handlers are to parade cattle.
32. Children under 12 years may not lead bulls.
33. Children aged 10 years and under who lead cattle must be accompanied by an adult.
34. Junior Champions in Beef Breed classes will be judged from not over 20 months classes.
35. Senior Champions in Beef Breed classes will be judged from the over 20 months classes.
36. In the judging of Reserve Champion and Reserve Junior Champion, the Exhibit second in the class of the Champions must also be paraded.
37. A Grand Champion Exhibit sash will be awarded in all Beef sections.
38. Perpetual trophies will remain in the RGAPS Administration Office.

BEEF JUDGING

39. Judging will be in order of the schedule unless altered by Chief Steward.
40. Progeny Classes: Classed animals are to be sired by the same bull but don't have to be owned by the sire's owner.
41. In the event of withdrawal from any section, the Breed Steward must be notified before judging.
42. Cattle deemed by the Cattle Superintendent to be out of show condition will not be permitted to parade before the judges.
43. If in the opinion of the Cattle Superintendent, an Exhibit is deemed dangerous for any reason whatsoever, the Exhibitor will be required to immediately remove the exhibit from the Showgrounds.
44. Exhibitors and Handlers displaying unsuitable behaviour and/or lack of decorum will be banned by the Committee from this show and potentially future shows.

45. Breeds with restricted classes the winner of each class is entitled to compete in respective Interbreed class. For example
 - a. Bull under 20 months in Junior Champion.
 - b. Bull 20 months and over in Senior Champion Bull.
 - c. Heifer under 20 months in Junior Champion
 - d. Heifer Cow 20 months and over in Senior Champion Cow Group of Three class in Champion Group of Three.
46. At the Committees discretion, if there are more than 8 head of cattle of one breed being exhibited in the Any Other Beef Breed class, they may be exhibited in their own breed classes (restricted or full dependant on number of head entered).
47. PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE AGE OF EXHIBITS
 - a. Under 12 months (born on or after 16th October 2021).
 - b. 12 months to 16 months (born on or between 21st June 2021 and 20th October 2021).
 - c. 16 months to 20 months (born on or between 21st February 2021 and 20th June 2021).
 - d. 20 months to 24 months (born on or between 21st October 2020 and 20th February 2021).
 - e. 2 years to 2½ years (born on or between 20st April 2020 and 20th October 2020).
 - f. 2½ years and over (born on or before 21st April 2020).
48. All Cattle entered into group classes must be owned by the one exhibiting stud.
57. Where Special prizes are offered in a Class, the First prize offered by RGAPS will be withdrawn unless otherwise specified.
58. RGAPS reserves the right to allot a trophy in place of prize money or vice-versa.
59. The Judges' may withhold a prize or award a lesser prize.
60. The Judges' decision is final.
61. RGAPS will not be held responsible in cases where wrong Class tickets have been given to Exhibitors after judging has commenced. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to check section tickets with the Prize Schedule prior to the Show.
62. The Committee/Stewards reserve the right to modify classes according to the number of entries received.
63. Protests awards based on non-compliance with the conditions of the Prize Schedule or the Regulations will be taken into consideration by RGAPS if lodged with the Chief Steward one hour after the Judge has made their award or for Classes where a prize is not awarded by 3:00pm on the day of competition together with \$50 as a guarantee of the bona fide of the protest. The money will be returned if the protest is upheld. RGAPS decision will be final and without further appeal, excluding the dog section, which is affiliated with and controlled by the Rules of Dogs Victoria.

GENERAL RGAPS RULES

ENTRIES

49. All Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the close of entries.
50. All entries must be lodged on the Official Entry Form or online, on or before the nominated closing date.
51. All entry fees as specified in Schedule must be paid at time of entry.
52. Exhibitors must give such information regarding their Exhibits as RGAPS may require and submit Statutory Declarations with such information and produce evidence if called upon by RGAPS. In case of non-compliance, the Exhibit may be disqualified, and the prize withheld.
53. RGAPS has the right to refuse any entry, refuse any Exhibit entered, the right to compete without giving any reason for same, provided the entrance money is returned.
54. Entry fees for withdrawn exhibits will not be refunded.

JUDGING

55. Exhibitors will be required to place Exhibits as directed by the Chief Stewards.
56. The decision of the Judge as to the merits of Exhibits shall be final and without appeal.

PRIZES

64. Perpetual Trophies will remain in the Administration Building, Geelong Showgrounds.
65. If, due to unforeseen circumstances sponsorship is not forthcoming for any sponsored class, the prizemoney/prize may not be provided by RGAPS.
66. RGAPS reserves the right to use photographs and videos of entries at any time, present or in the future.
67. Prizemoney is GST inclusive. If you are registered for GST, the onus is on the Exhibitor to remit GST to the ATO and provide RGAPS with a Tax Invoice.
68. Any prize (trophy, voucher, etc.) awarded by RGAPS at any of their competitions and left unclaimed for a period of six months, will be forfeited and cancelled by the RGAPS Management Council.
69. Any prizemoney cheques not presented within twelve (12) months from the date of the Show will be cancelled by the RGAPS Management Council.
70. Any infringement of these Regulations may disqualify the Exhibitor from taking a prize. Any dispute as to the construction of these Regulations or the interpretation of the Prize Schedule shall be determined by RGAPS, whose decision is final and without appeal.
71. Results will be posted on the Royal Geelong Show website after completion of the show.

ACCESS

72. For entry outside of show hours appropriate vehicle passes must be attached to the windscreen of the vehicle, otherwise entry will be refused.
73. Gate instructions must be strictly adhered to.

74. No vehicle is permitted entry after 9:00am.
75. No Exhibit will be admitted onto the Showgrounds, unless Exhibitor Pass is presented at the gate.
76. Security and Show gate personnel have the right to enforce all Regulations regarding gate access to the Geelong Showgrounds
77. Implements, machinery and commercial exhibits, livestock and general exhibits must be in their designated areas within the Showgrounds by 8:00am on each morning of the Show.

ANIMALS

78. No animals, implements etc. except those entered, will be allowed on the Showgrounds.
79. Exhibitors must state as accurately as possible, at time of entry, the date of birth of all stock in classes where age is specified, and in all sheep classes, the time of last shearing.
80. Dogs must be registered under the Regulations adopted by Dogs Victoria.
81. Water will be provided for stock exhibited, but Exhibitors must provide their own fodder.
82. All vehicles bringing livestock Exhibits to the yards must be removed from the Showgrounds after discharging their loads, or placed where directed by the Stewards of the Section.
83. Primary Producers who show their animals are required to have Public Liability Insurance.
84. If, in the opinion of RGAPS any exhibition of livestock is unsound, either temporary or otherwise, the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon of RGAPS may be obtained at cost of the exhibitor.
85. It is the owner's responsibility to provide security to ensure that their animals are kept safe and secure for the duration of their time at the Geelong Showgrounds.

PROPERTY & BEHAVIOUR

86. RGAPS shall not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss or damage of exhibits or displays, all exhibits and displays are accepted solely at the exhibitor's own risk. RGAPS will not be responsible for Exhibits, but every reasonable care will be taken of the same.
87. The Royal Geelong Agricultural & Pastoral Society will not be held liable for any injuries that may be suffered by a person or persons taking part on behalf of an Exhibitor. In the event of an incident, RGAPS will appoint attendants to take charge and control all of his/her entries.
88. All Exhibitors have a Duty of Care to avoid situations that could lead to injury to themselves or other people. This Duty of Care extends to the prevention of damage to property.
89. No Exhibitor shall interfere with the Exhibits in ANY WAY whatsoever during the time the Exhibition is open.
90. Anyone interfering without the permission of the Stewards may be expelled from the Showgrounds.
91. No person will be permitted to put any placard or advertisement on pens or grounds without the

permission of the Operations Manager. Proprietorship remains that of RGAPS.

92. If, in the opinion of the Stewards, the conduct of any Exhibitor or any other person shall be such as to demand such a course, they shall have the power to forfeit any or all prizes such Exhibitors may have won, and may further cause such person or Exhibitor and Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds.
93. Exhibitors must comply with any reasonable request of RGAPS representatives.
94. All areas must be kept clean and tidy with clearly defined and available access and exit routes always. Build-up of combustible waste must be avoided always.

SAFETY

95. **Care must be taken to minimize trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.**
96. **Exhibitors must notify the Section/Pavilion Supervisor or Administration immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulted in:**
 - a. the injury, illness or death of any person or animal.
 - b. the damage, destruction or loss of property.
97. **Emergency information and maps showing Emergency Assembly Points are in the various animal pavilions and buildings. Exhibitors should be familiar with these plans.**
98. **Exhibitors should supply their own Safety Switch (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.**
99. ***Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.***
100. **The use of double adapters is strictly prohibited. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection.**
101. **Beverages/Food brought onto the Showgrounds in glass containers is strictly forbidden.**
102. **Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.**
103. **Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.**
104. **No naked flames are permitted.**
105. **Firefighting and other Emergency Equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to Section/Pavilion Supervisor or Administration immediately.**
106. ***All Exhibitor electrical items, including leads, must have a current safety compliance tag.***

HOUSEKEEPING

- 107. Smoking is not permitted inside buildings, within 10m of a building entrance, near food sales and eating areas,
- 108. Alcohol is not permitted to be brought onto the Geelong Showgrounds, or to be consumed during public performances or while handling hazardous materials.
- 109. Security and Show personnel have the right to enforce all Regulations and control regarding people's behaviour and remove those persons as determined.
- 110. All waste, including liquids, must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.
- 111. Media comment about matters involving RGAPS or the Showgrounds is co-ordinated by either the Operations Manager or the President.

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals on offer.

Some states/territories require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document e.g. John's disease (JD) in WA and for Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) in Tasmania. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at:

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments in the last six (6) months and vaccinations within the last twelve (12) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer's recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. As variations to this general rule do occur (e.g. Silirum is given once only), you must use the manufacturer's recommendations.

At the date the declaration is made and as a result of the vaccination(s) given, the animals are considered protected from the diseases marked as treated.

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property(s). Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The **John's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS)** is a voluntary tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available at www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/jd-cattle-tools.

The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the 'JD in cattle' webpage). The *National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual - Grazing Livestock Production* provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. An ELISA test is available but is not recommended and also not accepted for entry of cattle to WA.

Sample test – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. See note above for ELISA test.

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.

Show Level Beef Cattle Parading Rules & Regulations

1. Age of parader must be 8 years & over as of the day of the Show.
2. Parader must be attired in suitable clothing including solid shoes or boots.
3. The parader must lead a heifer under 2 years as of the day of the Show only.
4. Paraders animal must be eligible for breed registration with their respective breed society or entered in an ordinary class with details of exhibit on the respective Show/Event entry form for insurance purposes.
5. The judge may ask the parader to swap animals if required.
6. Adult or steward assistance is acceptable for a parader under 12 years. (Preferred that parents or siblings are not the assistance)
7. Competitions can be split into several age groups depending on the number of entries and level of experience.
8. Parader competitions are conducted under the VAS & ASA regulations.
